Last Call for NW Citizen Corps Expo - September 16-17

The NW Citizen Corps Expo is a free event filled with hands-on workshops and info sessions with skills you can use to volunteer during a disaster including CPR/AED/FA and Stop the Bleed. The expo takes place Sept. 16-17 at Edmonds College in Lynnwood, with an additional meeting for CERT program managers on the 15th. Read full session descriptions and/or Register and pick your courses. Deadline to register is Sept. 1 or until all spots are filled, whichever comes first. Learn about basic triage, your role in the incident command system, radio communications, emergency planning for animal response, CPR/first aid/NARCAN training and more! The event wraps up with a disaster simulation drill to practice what you've learned.

Rapid Impact Survey Exercise, 5th Saturday EmComm Drill - Sept. 30

September is National Preparedness Month and September 30th is a 5th Saturday EmComm event. We will run our Rapid Impact Survey (RIS) Exercise in conjunction with the 5th Saturday Communications EmComm Drill from 9:00-12:00. We will gather at Public Works Operations and CERTs will drive the RIS routes, document and report simulated damages to the Issaquah Communications Support Team using various means of communications. We will be testing new maps and checklists, so feedback is a key objective. Everyone is invited to participate, whether you are new or experienced with RIS. At the completion of the exercise, our new emergency manager, Jared Schneider, will join us and is planning to hand out emergency worker cards to all emergency workers whose EW cards have expired and who have completed their CPR training and background checks. Salmon Days, Issaquah's award-winning event which celebrates the return of the salmon to their birthwaters, will be held on the first full weekend in October. Fall CERT Training and Final Disaster Simulation October 3 - 28

Eastside Fire & Rescue Wildfire Assessment Program - Summer Events
